

Important Message From Your Board President



Dear Seven Hills Neighbors,

Once again, a THANK YOU to residents of Seven Hills who take it upon themselves to make our community a better place. This month I want to recognize and

thank residents Joe Males, Mayor of Hemet, and Walter Pleasnick for their help in cleaning a property that has been unsightly for years. The Board had used every legal avenue available to try and get the property cleaned up with no success. Mr. Pleasnick and Joe Males teamed up, got a 40-yard dumpster delivered, and within two days the two of them, working with the resident, loaded the dumpster to capacity and it was hauled away. I want to point out that THEY loaded the dumpster! They didn't just talk the talk, they got in and pitched for the benefit of all.

The next HIGH PRIORITY message I have is how important it is to keep your RESIDENT INFORMATION up to date. With the invoices sent out for the 2024 POA Annual Fee was a new RESIDENT INFORMATION sheet to be returned to the office.

In recent weeks there have been two calls to the POA requesting EMERGENCY CONTACT information for a resident who needed emergency aid. Hours were lost because the Emergency Contact information in our files was not there or up to date. If you are a resident living alone, it's for your safety and security that the POA Office has current Emergency Contact information for your address. Even if you don't live alone, you might be out of town and if something happens at your house while you're away, the POA should be able to contact somebody guickly. Information will not be shared with anyone but First Responders who may be called to help you or an Emergency Room doctor trying to save you. If you didn't submit an up-to-date form or the name or phone number of your Emergency Contact has changed, you will find a copy of the new form we're using in this Newsletter. For your safety, please fill it out and mail it to the office, or drop it in the POA Drop Box at the entrance to the Members Club.

On the brighter side, I was very pleased to see more residents at our last POA meeting. Residents shared their concerns and suggestions and everyone who wanted to speak had the opportunity. Concerns expressed about trees and non-functioning lights were heard and we're working on it. The winner of the "Find the Icon" in the Newsletter was Frank Rodarte who will receive a \$25 Gift Card.

I hope to see even more of you at the next meeting, Wednesday, February 7th, at 6:30PM. Our speaker will be Christi Barrett, Superintendent of the Hemet Unified School District. Safety Monitor Report

For January 2024

November/December Sees a Rise in Safety Activity

12/20/2023—a resident on Apple Tree St. reported that an expensive Christmas lawn ornament was taken by

someone in the middle of the day. The act was confirmed with video footage from their security cameras. Investigation of recordings from other nearby cameras revealed that the car used by the perpetrator had no license plate. Below is a frame from camera footage, so it sounds like he is experienced. Contact safetymonitor@sevenhillspoaofhemet.com if you have any information.



Interestingly, I believe there is some resemblance between this gentleman and the one who was videoed in the tortoise robbery whose picture we published in the November newsletter. This resemblance wouldn't stand up in court, but it suggests we may have an individual who knows Seven Hills well and is using it as a department store. Or, he may have a confederate who is feeding him information. **1/4/2024**—a resident on Flame Tree Way reported a car parked on the street for an extended period of time. 2 underage individuals were seen exiting the car. The resident was told to call the Hemet PD nonemergency number (951-765-2400) and report it.

1/9/2024—a resident reported door-to-door salespeople representing themselves as associated with SCE in Seven Hills. The Safety Monitor has noticed stickers placed on mailboxes from this company, which is a clever way to bypass USPS regulations banning non-USPS mail from mailboxes.

1/10/2024—a resident reported that a house with the front door open had been observed on Jasmine Way and the owner was not home. The situation was investigated and no suspicious activity was found. The door was closed and locked.

Doorbell Cameras

A topic that I have been asked about a fair amount regards home doorbell cameras. I believe this is one way to improve your home security without an inordinate cost. Ring first popularized this type of camera, but more companies have brought their own versions to market – some with their own specific features and advantages. Some features can be very useful and worth the extra cost. Others, not so much, depending on your needs.

For those of you not familiar with doorbell cameras, they are a device mounted next to your front door that includes a camera. Anyone coming

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to your door will trigger a motion sensor and will be recorded by the camera.

Those recordings are stored and may be accessed later. These devices also contain a speaker and microphone, so you may communicate with anyone detected by the camera. You don't actually have to answer the door personally. This all displays on the smart phone (Android or iPhone) you have specified. So, if you want to see who is at the door, you can view them live, or in the recordings later on. Since this all works through your WiFi, you don't have to be home to do any of this.

If you do currently have a doorbell, the doorbell camera will be wired into the 12 to 24 volt AC circuit. You can get either a non-battery or battery-powered type. If you opt for the battery type, you will have backup if the power goes out.

If you don't already have a doorbell, the device is powered by a battery. It will activate a wireless doorbell inside your home, which you purchase separately. For those of you who have always dreamed of having a doorbell, this is for you.

If you purchase a battery-powered doorbell camera and have a functional doorbell, the circuit power will keep the battery charged. If you don't have a working doorbell, the camera battery will have to be charged periodically (usually about every 3 months). Although, I have installed these on houses without an active doorbell and installed a 12v transformer in addition to keep the battery charged.

To keep things simple, I would recommend the two Ring models. A basic one (\$100) does not have a battery and works solely from your extant

powered doorbell. The other (\$160) has a battery and can work without having an existing powered doorbell.

The device does require WiFi to set up and to employ the ability to communicate remotely with whomever is at the door. There are also a variety of video storage solutions available that expand the basic storage but incur a monthly charge. So, as you can see, you have many choices, maybe too many.

I would be glad to answer any questions you might have about doorbell cameras and the specific situation at your home. If you are deterred from getting a doorbell camera because you don't think you can install it, I would be happy to give you a hand with it. I have installed many Ring doorbells and in a variety of situations. Or, you may have a friend or neighbor who could do this for you. I have several names of people who are willing to help.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2024

California winters may be mild compared to other parts of the

country. The weather can nonetheless take a toll on your property. When a home isn't properly winterized, the heavy storms can cause everything from dry rot and roof leaks to crawl space flooding and substantially less energy efficiency which could rack up the bucks. That's why, even in California, it's crucial to perform preventative measures on your home and property in the winter. Here are some tips for keeping your home winter ready, both indoors and out.

Interior:

Service Heating System

Depending on the type of heating system you have, there are a few home maintenance things you should do. If you have a furnace, check the filter and change it out if needed. Those with gas should have a cleaning about every three years. Also, have your heating system inspected and serviced by a professional annually. This will ensure your system is working properly and rule out any potential hazards.

Check Fireplace & Chimney

If your home has a fireplace, you'll need to make sure it's performing properly. When a fireplace or stove isn't maintained, it can lead to safety hazards like chimney fires or carbon monoxide poisoning. That's why it's always a good idea to have yours professionally cleaned and inspected for cracks and debris.

Check Smoke Detector & Carbon Monoxide Batteries

According to the U.S. Fire Administration, heating is the cause of 27 percent of structural fires.

Make sure all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working in your



home. Replace batteries in smoke/ carbon monoxide detectors once a year, or better yet, replace your detectors with special 10-year battery units. Many people just change it out when it starts giving you the low battery beeping noise. With something as important as this, you can't be too careful, and batteries won't break your bank.

Reverse Ceiling Fans

If you have ceiling fans, there should be a switch to make the fan blades run clockwise. Running the blades in a clockwise position during the colder months can push heated air down. This makes rooms with high ceilings more comfortable.

Inspect Your Water Heater

Being without hot water is never fun. You can reduce the chances of water heater failure during winter by performing an inspection. Test your water heater's pressure relief valve. This will prevent mineral and corrosion buildup, which safeguards against leaks. It will also help your heater run more efficiently. In addition to checking for water leaks, clean the air intake screen to ensure the burner is receiving enough oxygen. If you haven't flushed your water heater's tank in more than a year, it's a good time to do so.

Exterior:

Check all Windows & Doors

Walk around the outside of the house and do a visual inspection of all windows and doors, looking for gaps where the trim meets the siding.

Caulk any gaps around windows or doors. Open doors and check the condition of the weather stripping. You can check for air leaks around windows and doors with a lit candle. The candle will flicker everywhere the wind's getting in. Maintaining weather stripping on the doors and windows will greatly improve home energy efficiency. If the issue persists, consult a window professional.

Check Drainage

Standing water can cause a lot of problems, from foundation erosion to crawl space flooding and puddling on your property. One simple measure to mitigate this is to ensure all gutter downspouts drain away from your home.

As for your overall property, there are two types of standing water that can cause problems: surface water and groundwater. Most surface water issues can be amended with a strategically placed surface drain, while groundwater issues are usually addressed using a French drain. Have a drainage professional identify the sources of your property's drainage issues and prescribe solutions.

Inspect Roof

It's important to clean your roof and verify its condition yearly. Start by clearing leaves, tree branches and other debris off your roof and from your gutters, paying special attention to valleys and other areas where debris can collect and cause leaks. Next, inspect your roof's shingles and waterproofing components, including seals and flashings around penetrations like pipes, vents, skylights, and chimneys. Since the summer heat can cause rubber seals and caulking to wear out prematurely, it's wise to check these and replace any that are worn out.

Trim Tree Limbs

Trees can damage roofs and siding by trapping moisture near the house, scraping surfaces, and dropping limbs. Prune them to keep them off the house. If you own a home with stucco siding that extends all the way to the ground, avoid foundation plants altogether because the water necessary to maintain them can wick into the stucco, causing the stucco to fail. Keep plants at least 3 feet away from houses with full stucco siding.

Touch Up Failing Paint

House paint isn't just for looks—it also seals the wood siding against moisture intrusion. Go around your home and assess the condition of the paint. Touch up any areas that look deteriorated; if the paint is in poor overall condition, schedule a professional repainting job.

WEEDS - unfortunately it is that time of year when once again we will be dealing with lots of weeds appearing in our front yards - thank you for removing them. Remember, if you spray the weeds, please make sure you remove them as soon as they have died. For those of you who wish to use a NATURAL SPRAY, combine 1 Gallon white vinegar, 1 cup table salt (you can substitute 16 oz lemon juice) 1 tablespoon Dawn detergent, spray the weeds on a warm sunny day.

A reminder of how CC&R violations are handled by me: 1st, I send a gentle letter letting you know what the violation is, usually with an attached PICTURE, giving you 10 days in most cases to correct the concern. If the violation is **NOT** taken care of, I then send a violation notice, usually giving another 10 days to correct the concern. If it is NOT taken care of, I then turn the concern over to our Administrator – she will send out a letter, inviting you to appear before the SHPOA board for a SHOW CAUSE HEARING, to give your explanation of why the concern has not been taken of. After you leave, the board members discuss if there will be a \$500.00 FINE imposed. If a resident decides NOT TO SHOW UP for the meeting, it is an AUTOMATIC \$500.00 FINE. Please keep in mind, I always try to work with residents to SOLVE the concerns before ever being called in for a show cause hearing - providing they give me a call.

Everyone should have received their **BILLING FOR** THEIR 2024 DUES, along with copies of the **RESIDENT** and **EMERGENCY INFORMATION** FORMS. IT IS NOT AN OPTION that these forms be completed and filled out, EVEN IF YOUR INFORMATION HAS NOT CHANGED. Having these forms newly filled out each year protects YOU and YOUR HOME!

Architectural Request Form

Please note that it is the goal of the Architectural Director to work with every homeowner to ensure the structural soundness of the improvement being proposed is adequate and that the safety of the homeowner and neighboring property owners will be protected. Every attempt will be made by the Committee to review the plans and supporting documents submitted to it as quickly as possible to avoid unnecessary delays with your project.

ARTICLE VIII ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

8.1 Improvements and Changes Require Prior Approval. No Improvement of any kind shall be commenced, erected or maintained within the Property by an Owner, nor shall any exterior addition to or change or alteration be made in or to any Lot by an Owner until the plans and specifications showing the nature, color, kind, shape, height (including front, side and rear elevations), materials, and location of the same shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Board as to quality of workmanship and materials, harmony of external design and location in relation to surrounding structures, setback lines, topography and finish grade elevation. Prior to submittal of plans and specifications to the Board as provided in Section 8.2 of these CC&Rs, the Owner shall obtain a building permit from the City for the Improvements and comply with all City requirements set forth in the City Municipal Code and other applicable laws.

ARTICLE 8.1 Architectural Changes - Start and completion of work: Prior to submittal of improvements and changes homeowners must have a timeline of completion. Architectural Committee should have an approximate beginning date and completion date subject to permissible delays. All Improvements and changes approved by the Architectural Chairperson must be commenced within 3 days following the date of approval and must be completed within 30 days of the approval date. Any work not completed within the time frame will be deemed unapproved, requiring the homeowner to resubmit the application for approval before undertaking the project. Rule Approved by Board of Directors 3/7/18.

8.6.4 Roofing. Replacement roofing shall conform to the roofing being replaced. Homeowners may make a request to the Board in writing with samples of other types of roofing, including asphalt. Samples of material and colors to conform and perform to quality of existing roofing material and blend with roofing colors of adjacent buildings. Extreme color variations shall not be permitted. All changes shall be reviewed by the Board and permission, or denial be given in writing to Owner.

Washing Weighted Blankets

<u>ThisCouldBeTriggering.tumblr.com</u>: This Tumblr blog catalogs potential warnings for movies and TV shows, and for books and music.

IMDb.com: The popular movie and TV database has a feature called "Parents Guide" that might contain trigger warnings. Scroll down on anything you want to watch and click on "Parents Guide" below the "Storyline" section.

Making A Budget You Can Keep

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
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
